

#213 Amie is for sale

After 30 years of sailing and repair, hard work and good times, I can't keep up anymore. It's time for **Amie** to have a new home.

She's 25' on deck, 22' on waterline, and designed to the plans from Howard Chapelle's book "American Small Sailing Craft". She was built in Ketchikan, Alaska from 1974-78, was sailed to Puget Sound in 1980, and has been here ever since.

She's planked in Red Cedar on Oak Frames and a Douglas Fir keel. She leaks very little, especially if sailed often and vigorously. She has 2200 pounds of lead bars for internal Ballast (I should know-I've taken them in and out several times). Spars are spruce, rigging is galvanized, and the tanbark sails are 10-15 years old. Included is an 8HP Johnson long shaft 2-cycle outboard. Still starts and runs pretty reliably.

I do want to sell her fairly quickly-We lose our Lake Union (Seattle) moorage at the end of this summer (2024). I'm asking \$3,000.00 or best offer. But, more importantly, I want her to go to a good home with a new owner who knows wooden boats, and is willing to maintain her for many more years of adventure.
